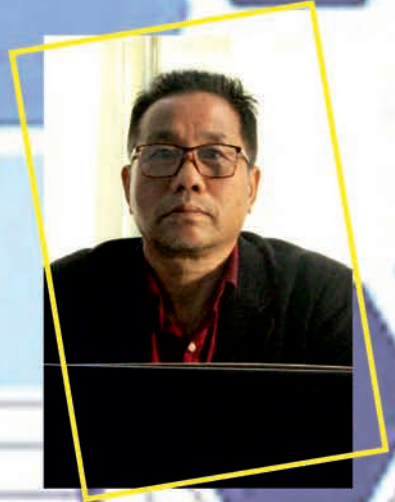

To disciple the nations, the Discipleship Bible College was started in 1981 by International Evangelistic Fellowship, as the outcome of the mighty Revival Movement in Nagaland in 1970s. From a humble beginning today DBC is one of the oldest Bible College in Dimapur, Nagaland and one of the highest enrollment among the accredited colleges of Asian Theological Colleges in India.
